

TOM BENTLEY-FISHER - RESUME

YAT/BENTLEY CENTRE FOR PERFORMANCE , OAKLAND/BERKELEY ARTISTIC DIRECTOR 2017 - PRESENT

Founder and Artistic Director. The Centre offers a coherent and dynamic international teaching program to actors, directors, teachers, and dancers, based on the work of Yat Malmgren and Tom Bentley-Fisher. The mandate includes the mounting of full productions, nationally and internationally, with those graduate students who have attained a degree of excellence in the work. YBC (Yat/Bentley Centre) has expanded its studios to England and Los Angeles.

TANT PER TANT, CANADA/BARCELONA ARTISTIC DIRECTOR 2007-2016

Artistic Director of Tant per Tant, a theatre company dedicated to the translation, exchange and production of international plays. Productions directed include *Oooo*, by Gerard Vázquez, *The Vindication of Senyora Clito Mestres*, by Montserrat Roig, *Temptation*, by Carle Batle, and Pau Miró's trilogy *Buffalos*, *Lions*, and *Giraffes*. Programming included a three-year exchange project, bringing six Canadian and Catalan playwrights and their plays to theatre stages across Canada and Catalonia. Projects also involved international staged readings, workshops of new plays, and dramaturgical work on new translations. In 2016, Tant per Tant presented a multi-lingual version of Marie Clement's *Burning Vision* as a co-production with The Barcelona International Grec Festival and Q-ars Teatre. Directed by Tom Bentley-Fisher, it featured a mixed cast of North American and Catalan actors, original live music, dance, and film.

Q-ARS TEATRE, BARCELONA, SPAIN 2009-2010

Creator and director of *Iliada*, an all-female version of The Iliad, created for the International Barcelona Grec 09 Festival, with a subsequent tour to regional theatres in Catalonia. It was translated from Catalan to Spanish and re-staged in 2010 for the Festival de Teatro Clásico de Mérida, performing in Teatre Romano, a Roman theatre built in 100 B.C. and designated as a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

GLOBAL AGE PROJECT, AURORA THEATRE, BERKELEY PRODUCER 2005-2008

Ran an international discovery and developmental program bringing playwrights and their work for staged workshops and possible production. Plays directed include *Happy Slap*, by Laura Jacqmin, *Events with Life's Leftovers*, by Alberto Villarreal, and *Los Once*, by Finnian Sullivan. Program included new commissioned plays by Craig Lucas and Amy Freed.

TWENTY-FIFTH THEATRE, CANADA ARTISTIC DIRECTOR 1985-1998

Established the theatre's focus as the discovery, development and production of original Canadian plays. Becoming one of Canada's flagship companies for producing world premieres, the theatre developed a strong reputation for innovative and socially responsive work. Accomplishments during a twelve-year tenure:

Produced twelve full seasons of original plays.

Directed over 40 productions. (List of the plays available on request.)

Established programs for new play development.

Toured and co-produced throughout Western Canada.

Established Outreach Programs with communities not normally associated with mainstream theatre.

Established Student Mentor Program for young writers from isolated rural communities.

Produced plays and festival work from Canada's indigenous communities.

SASKATOON INTERNATIONAL FRINGE FESTIVAL FOUNDER/PRODUCER - 1990-1998

Initiated and produced the Saskatoon International Fringe Festival, an eight-day theatre event consisting of over eighty provincial, national and international theatre companies, performing in seven indoor venues. The purpose of the Festival was to create opportunities for local artists who were finding it difficult to present their work, break down the traditional barriers between the artist and audience, and celebrate the community at large. Attendance grew from eight thousand to sixty thousand in five years, supported by a volunteer base of over four hundred.

SENIOR ARTIST GRANT 1993-1994

Awarded an Arts Board Grant to observe and work with theatre and dance companies throughout Europe and Asia. The focus of the eight-month long sabbatical was to experience the work of companies creating innovative and cross-disciplinary presentation. This resulted in returning to Canada to develop and produce projects incorporating less traditional forms of development and production.

WRITING - FICTION /PLAYS:

Work includes *Blind Man's Drum*, a collection of short stories published by Thistledown Press, a finalist for Best Fiction, Saskatchewan Book Awards, and *Wars and Rumours of Wars*, a finalist for the National Magazine Award in Humor. Play commissions include *New York is Big But This is Biggar, the Musical*, *Friends*, produced by Theatre Direct and published by Red Deer Press, *Hoopla*, and *Iliada*, adapted from Alessandro Baricco's version of the Iliad.
