The BAILEY TWINS - the two young men from the farm close to Perdue who perform all important functions at the same time, including eating, yawning, scratching and praying. They perform THE ENTIRE HISTORY OF BIGGAR IN TEN MINUTES OR SO

ACT ONE

SCENE ONE

A committee has been struck to plan for an upcoming theatre production. They are meeting on the bare stage of the Majestic Theatre. It is early evening.

Freda: How can we possibly do something original - there's nothing original here?

Eric: There's the whole history of the community to draw on Freda.
